2024 COPS Office Anti-Heroin Task Force Program

The **COPS Office Anti-Heroin Task Force (AHTF)** program advances public safety by making competitive grants to state law enforcement agencies in states with high per capita rates of primary treatment admissions for the purpose of locating or investigating illicit activities through statewide collaboration relating to the distribution of heroin, fentanyl, or carfentanil or to the unlawful distribution of prescription opioids.

WHEN: Deadline for first part of application in Grants.gov is **June 20, 2024**, at 4:59 p.m. ET. Deadline for completed application in JustGrants is **June 26, 2024**, at 4:59 p.m. ET.

Start EARLY. Each of these is more than a one-day process.

WHERE: **1.** Register at www.grants.gov.
2. Complete the application in the [JustGrants Justice Grants System](#).

HOW: Online only. No hard copies sent by U.S. Mail or electronic copies sent via email.

Funding provisions

- AHTF provides funds directly to state law enforcement agencies in states with high per capita rates of primary treatment admissions for heroin, fentanyl, carfentanil, or other opioids.
- AHTF funding must be used to locate or investigate illicit activities through statewide collaboration related to the distribution of heroin, fentanyl, or carfentanil or the unlawful distribution of prescription opioids.
- AHTF is open only to state law enforcement agencies with primary law enforcement authority over heroin, fentanyl, carfentanil, and other opioids seizures and investigations.

Approximately \$35 million in funding is available for 2024 AHTF. Each award is three years (36 months) in duration. Each award recipient may receive a maximum of \$4 million, and there is no cost share or matching funds requirement. AHTF funding is not available for treatment programs or prosecution of heroin, fentanyl, carfentanil, or other opioid-related activities. All awards are subject to the availability of appropriated funds and any modifications or additional requirements that may be imposed by law.

How to Apply

Step 1. Confirm your entity's System of Award Management (SAM) registration information. Register with SAM or confirm that your SAM registration is active and accurate.

Step 2. Confirm that the contact information (name and email address) for your agency's electronic business point of contact (E-BIZ POC) in SAM is accurate.

Step 3. Register with Grants.gov or confirm your existing registration.

Step 4. Submit the first part of your application in Grants.gov. Deadline to complete this step is **June 20, 2024**.

Step 5. Onboard your agency to the JustGrants Justice Grants System.

Step 6. Complete and submit the second part of your application in JustGrants (<https://justicegrants.usdoj.gov>).
