



Fact Sheet for Businesses and Communities Combating Labor Trafficking



The Labor Trafficking Resource Center is a comprehensive one-stop shop of resources available at https://cops.usdoj.gov/labor_trafficking. In addition to the resources developed as part of the COPS Office / IIR **Partnerships to Address Labor Trafficking** project, the resource center also houses existing labor trafficking-related materials available from federal partners and materials developed by nongovernmental organizations that are federally funded and supported.

Resources are available for download individually and collectively in toolkits, which are organized by target audience (law enforcement, prosecutors, businesses, community partners, and general). The newly developed resources targeting businesses and communities are outlined here:

What Is Labor Trafficking?

This handout explains the federal definition of labor trafficking and characteristics of victims and perpetrators.

Labor Trafficking Awareness Campaign: How Can I Help?

This video serves as a public awareness campaign for the general public, nonprofit organizations, faith-based groups, etc., and includes indicators of labor trafficking, who to contact, what to do if you or someone you know has been victimized, and how nonprofits and community groups can assist.

Indicators of Labor Trafficking for Businesses

This flyer / poster provides general indicators of labor trafficking as an awareness tool for businesses that may encounter labor trafficking in the workplace or through home services.

Indicators of Labor Trafficking: Food and Beverage Industry

This infographic identifies victims of labor trafficking, specific to the food and beverage industry, and provides contact information to report suspected trafficking incidents.

Indicators of Labor Trafficking: Hospitality Industry

This infographic identifies victims of labor trafficking, specific to the hospitality industry, and provides contact information to report suspected trafficking incidents.

Indicators of Labor Trafficking: School Personnel

This infographic identifies victims of labor trafficking, specific to school personnel, and provides contact information to report suspected trafficking incidents.



Indicators of Labor Trafficking: Transportation and Delivery Drivers

This infographic identifies victims of labor trafficking, specific to transportation and delivery drivers, and provides contact information to report suspected trafficking incidents.

Emerging and Promising Practices in Communications Regarding Labor Trafficking

This webinar comprises promising practices and considerations in effective communications among law enforcement and the community regarding labor trafficking.

Labor Trafficking Awareness Campaign: Connecting Law Enforcement and the Business Community

This video serves as a public awareness campaign for law enforcement to share with the business community and includes indicators of labor trafficking, who to contact, ways for businesses to assist, etc.

The resource center will also store previously recorded COPS Office/IIR Partnerships to Address Labor Trafficking webinars that cover topical issues and case studies related to the supplemental handouts and infographics provided, with the audio and speaker presentations available for download.
