<p>School incident data: Reduction in reported incidents of theft from the locker rooms during gym class hours.</p>	<p>Survey of male students: Reduction in reported fear of being beaten up if one uses the boys' restrooms.</p>	<p>School disciplinary referrals: Decrease in the number of school referrals of students who are caught using drugs in the parking lot during school.</p>	<p>Survey of teachers: Increase in teachers' knowledge of signs and symptoms of gang membership.</p>
<p>Police crime reports: Reduction in the average reported value of items stolen from locker rooms during gym class hours.</p>	<p>School incident data: Reduction in the number of reported incidents of fights or assaults in the boys' restrooms.</p>	<p>Police crime reports: Decrease in the number of police reports of students using drugs in the parking lot.</p>	
<p>Survey of students: Increase in knowledge of theft prevention strategies for reducing locker room theft.</p>		<p>Survey of students: Increase in students' knowledge of the health and legal consequences of drug use in the parking lot.</p>	
<p>Survey of students: Increase in the use of theft prevention strategies (e.g., locks, leaving certain items at home).</p>		<p>Survey of students: Decrease in self-reports of drug usage in the student parking lot.</p>
