# **2016 Community Policing Development Program**

Community Policing Development (CPD) funds are used to advance the practice of community policing in law enforcement agencies through training and technical assistance and the development of innovative community policing strategies, applied research, guidebooks, and best practices that are national in scope and responsive to the solicitation topic requirements.

## COPS Community Policing Development Awards

The 2016 CPD Program fundedprojects related to a number of public safety topic areas, including the following:

- Microgrant Initiative for Law Enforcement
- Critical Response Technical Assistance
- Community Policing Emerging Issues Forums
- Law Enforcement Led 21st Century Policing Demonstration Projects
- 21st Century Policing Implementation Projects
- Community Policing Training Projects

### **Funding Provisions**

In FY 2016, the COPS Office awarded nearly \$7.5 million under the CPD program.

Provisions include the following:

- The CPD solicitation was open to all public governmental agencies, profit and nonprofit institutions, institutions of higher education, community groups, and faith-based organizations. Accepted proposals were designed to innovatively advance the field, were cost effective in their approach, and demonstrated an understanding of the principles of community policing and law enforcement.
- Most awards are two years (24 months) in duration, and there is no local match. Microgrants are one year (12 months) in duration, and there is also no local match.
