FY 2024 Accreditation Program Community Policing Development

Community Policing Development (CPD) funds are used to develop the capacity of law enforcement to implement effective practices, outcomes, and strategies to prevent crime and promote safe communities. The CPD Accreditation program awards funding for law enforcement agencies to complete the process of accreditation, as well as the work of national and state accreditation bodies that support accreditation. To obtain accreditation, a law enforcement agency must ensure all policies and procedures are of the highest standards and in compliance with those defined by the accreditation entity. The community benefits when it is assured its law enforcement personnel are following best practice policies and procedures to provide efficient, effective, and fair policing.

when: Deadline for first part of application in Grants.gov is May 21, 2024, at 4:59 p.m. ET. Deadline for completed application in JustGrants is May 28, 2024, at 4:59 p.m. ET.

Start EARLY. The process takes more than one day.

WHERE:

- Register online with <u>www.sam.gov</u> to obtain a Unique Entity Identifier (UEI) and <u>www.grants.gov</u> to complete the Grants.gov application package.
- **2.** Complete the application in the <u>JustGrants Justice</u> Grants System.

How: Online only. No hard copies sent by U.S. Mail or electronic copies sent via email.

FY24 Accreditation — Community Policing Development

This year's Accreditation CPD program has three open solicitations:

- Enhancing Existing Law Enforcement Accreditation Entities—Community Policing Development
- Addressing Gaps in State and Regional Accreditation— Community Policing Development
- Supporting Law Enforcement Agencies Seeking Accreditation—Community Policing Development

Please see the chart on page 2 for an overview description of each solicitation. All awards are subject to the availability of appropriated funds and any modifications or additional requirements that may be imposed by law.

Funding Provisions

In addition to the table, provisions include the following:

- Applications should be responsive to the solicitation.
 Detailed descriptions of eligibility and additional information are available in the individual solicitation guides.
- There is up to \$6,500,000 in funding available through the FY 2024 Accreditation CPD program. Each award is two years (24 months) in length. There is no local match.

How to Apply

Applicants are first required to register online with www.sam.gov to obtain their Unique Entity Identifier and www.grants.gov to complete the Grants.gov application package. Deadline to complete this step is **May 21, 2024**, at 4:59 p.m. ET. After submitting the Grants.gov application package, applicants will receive an email with instructions on completing the second part of the Accreditation CPD application through JustGrants.

Complete application packages for the FY 2023 Accreditation CPD solicitation are due by **May 28, 2024,** at 4:59 p.m. ET. Before submitting your application, please review the appropriate solicitation guide and materials. Applications in hard or electronic format sent via email or U.S. Mail will not be accepted.

Please note: The COPS Office requires two authorized representatives (Law Enforcement Executive/Program Official and Government Executive/Financial Official) for its grant applications. Confirm your two authorized representatives complete the steps to create their accounts. If they do not, the delay may prevent timely submission of your application.
