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FY 2024 Law Enforcement Products and Resources Community Policing Development

Community Policing Development (CPD) funds are used to develop the capacity of law enforcement to implement community policing strategies by providing guidance on promising practices through the development and testing of innovative strategies; building knowledge about effective practices and outcomes; and supporting new, creative approaches to preventing crime and promoting safe communities. The FY 2024 CPD Law Enforcement Products and Resources program will fund projects that develop products and resources specifically designed for national distribution that offer creative ideas to advance crime fighting, community engagement, problem solving, or organizational changes in support of community policing.

WHEN: Deadline for first part of application in Grants.gov is May 28, 2024, at 4:59 p.m. ET. Deadline for completed application in JustGrants is June 4,

2024, at 4:59 p.m. ET.

Start EARLY. The process takes more than one day.

WHERE:

- Register online with <u>www.sam.gov</u> to obtain a Unique Entity Identifier (UEI) and <u>www.grants.gov</u> to complete the Grants.gov application package.
- 2. Complete the application in the <u>JustGrants Justice</u>
 Grants System.

How: Online only. No hard copies sent by U.S. Mail or electronic copies sent via email.

FY24 Community Policing Development: Law Enforcement Products and Resources

This year's CPD Law Enforcement Products and Resources program has one open solicitation. Proposed initiatives must be national in scope, which the COPS Office defines as intentionally developed to benefit agencies nationwide, and must directly support the advancement of community policing and the importance of law enforcement and communities working together to address public safety issues.

Please see page 2 for an overview description of the solicitation. All awards are subject to the availability of appropriated funds and any modifications or additional requirements that may be imposed by law.

The COPS Office is committed to advancing work that promotes civil rights and equity, increases access to justice, supports crime victims and individuals impacted by the justice system, strengthens community safety and protects the public from crime and evolving threats, and builds trust between law enforcement and the community.

Funding Provisions

Provisions include the following:

- Applications should be responsive to the solicitation, have substantial subject matter expertise in the topic area and propose initiatives that significantly advance the field of community policing. Applicants must identify how the topic is innovative and national in scope and how the proposed product or resource would benefit the broader law enforcement field and advance the practice of community policing among the nation's law enforcement agencies. Detailed descriptions of eligibility and additional information are available in the solicitation guide.
- This solicitation is open to all for-profit (commercial) and nonprofit institutions, institutions of higher education, community groups, and faith-based organizations. There is up to \$4.75 million in funding available through the FY 2024 CPD Law Enforcement Products and Resources program. Each award is up to \$500,000 and is two years (24 months) in length. There is no local match.

How to Apply

Applicants are first required to register online with www.sam.gov to obtain their Unique Entity Identifier and www.grants.gov to complete the Grants.gov application package. Deadline to complete this step is May 28, 2024. After submitting the Grants.gov application package, applicants will receive an email with instructions on completing the second part of the Law Enforcement Products and Resources CPD application through JustGrants.

Complete application packages for the FY 2024 CPD Law Enforcement Products and Resources solicitation are due by **June 4, 2024,** at 4:59 p.m. ET. Before submitting your application, please review the appropriate solicitation guide and materials. Applications in hard or electronic format sent via email or U.S. Mail will not be accepted.

Please note: The COPS Office requires two authorized representatives (Law Enforcement Executive/Program Official and Government Executive/Financial Official) for its grant applications. Confirm your two authorized representatives complete the steps to create their accounts. If they do not, the delay may prevent timely submission of your application.
