2024 Collaborative Reform Initiative Program

The **Collaborative Reform Initiative (CRI)** program encompasses three programs offering expert services to state, local, territorial, and tribal law enforcement agencies, ranging in scope and complexity. The continuum of services is designed to build trust between law enforcement agencies and the communities they serve; improve operational efficiencies and effectiveness; enhance officer safety and wellness; and develop and disseminate evidence-based, promising, and innovative public safety practices.

WHEN:

Deadline for first part of application in Grants.gov is **April 16, 2024**, at 4:59 p.m. ET. Deadline for completed application in JustGrants is **April 23, 2024**, at 4:59 p.m. ET.

Start EARLY. The process takes more than one day.

WHERE:

- Register online with <u>www.sam.gov</u> to obtain a Unique Entity Identifier (UEI) and <u>www.grants.gov</u> to complete the Grants.gov application package.
- 2. Complete the application in the <u>JustGrants Justice</u>
 Grants System.

How: Online only. No hard copies sent by U.S. Mail or electronic copies sent via email.

Funding Provisions

Provisions include the following:

- Proposals should be responsive to the solicitation and identify specific program goals that will be directly accomplished if awarded CRI funding. Detailed descriptions of eligibility and additional information are available in the solicitation guides.
- There is up to \$7.5 million in funding available. Awards made under all solicitations are one year (12 months) in length. There is no local match.

How to Apply

Applicants are first required to register via www.grants.gov and complete an SF-424. Deadline to complete this step is April 16, 2024. After submitting the SF-424, applicants will receive an email with instructions on completing the second part of the CRI application through the JustGrants System.

Complete application packages for the FY 2024 CRI solicitations are due by **April 23, 2024**, at 4:59 p.m. ET. Before submitting your application, please review the appropriate CRI Solicitation Guide. Applications in hard or electronic format sent via email or U.S. Mail will not be accepted.

Please note: the COPS Office requires two authorized representatives (Program Official and Financial Official) for its applications. Your two authorized representatives must complete all the steps to create their accounts. If they do not, the delay may prevent timely submission of your application.
