FY 2024 Safer Outcomes: Enhancing De-Escalation and Crisis Response Training for Law Enforcement

Safer Outcomes funds are used to promote training on de-escalation and crisis response for law enforcement officers, support personnel employed by law enforcement agencies, and mental health professionals working on crisis intervention teams as employees of a law enforcement agency or under a legal agreement with a law enforcement agency. Supported training programs must address one or more of the following areas of focus:

- 1. De-escalation tactics and alternatives to use of force
- 2. Safely responding to an individual experiencing a mental or behavioral health or suicidal crisis
- 3. Safe encounters with individuals with disabilities
- 4. Successfully participating on a crisis intervention team
- 5. Making referrals to community-based services and support

WHEN:

Deadline for first part of application in Grants.gov is **July 23, 2024**, at 4:59 p.m. ET. Deadline for completed application in JustGrants is **July 30, 2024**, at 4:59 p.m. ET.

Start EARLY. The process takes more than one day.

WHERE:

- Register online with <u>www.sam.gov</u> to obtain a Unique Entity Identifier (UEI) and <u>www.grants.gov</u> to complete the Grants.gov application package.
- 2. Complete the application in the <u>JustGrants Justice</u>
 Grants System.

How: Online only. No hard copies sent by U.S. Mail or electronic copies sent via email.

FY24 Safer Outcomes: Enhancing De-Escalation and Crisis Response Training for Law Enforcement

This year's Safer Outcomes program has three open solicitations:

- Curriculum Integration for Law Enforcement Academies and State-Level Training Commissions
- Expansion of Regional De-Escalation Training Centers
- Support for Law Enforcement Agencies

Please see the chart on page 2 for an overview description of each solicitation. All awards are subject to the availability of appropriated funds and any modifications or additional requirements that may be imposed by law.

Funding Provisions

In addition to the table, provisions include the following:

- Applications should be responsive to the solicitation selected, significantly advance the field of community policing, and demonstrate an understanding of community policing as it pertains to the application topic. Applicants must identify specific program goals that will be directly accomplished if awarded Safer Outcomes funding. Detailed descriptions of eligibility and additional information are available in the individual solicitation guides.
- There is up to \$18 million in funding available through the FY 2024 Safer Outcomes program. Each award is two years (24 months) in length. There is no local match.

How to Apply

Applicants are first required to register online with www.sam.gov to obtain their Unique Entity Identifier and www.grants.gov to complete the Grants.gov application package. Deadline to complete this step is **July 23, 2024**. After submitting the Grants.gov application package, applicants will receive an email with instructions on completing the second part of the Safer Outcomes application through JustGrants.

Complete application packages for the FY 2024 Safer Outcomes solicitation are due by **July 30, 2024**, at 4:59 p.m. ET. Before submitting your application, please review the appropriate solicitation guide and materials. Applications in hard or electronic format sent via email or U.S. Mail will not be accepted.

Please note: The COPS Office requires two authorized representatives (Law Enforcement Executive/Program Official and Government Executive/Financial Official) for its grant applications. Confirm your two authorized representatives complete the steps to create their accounts. If they do not, the delay may prevent timely submission of your application.
