2025 Community Policing Development Program

Community Policing Development (CPD) funds are used to assist State, local, and Tribal law enforcement agencies with the implementation of common sense policing strategies, provide information on promising and effective practices, develop and test innovative strategies, and support new, creative approaches to preventing crime to address Administration priority areas. The CPD program consists of four subprograms including supporting law enforcement accreditation efforts, microgrants to law enforcement agencies to support innovation, and the development of knowledge products and resources. CPD funds also support the existing COPS Office training portal and the National Blue Alert notification system.

Funding Provisions


Provisions include the following:
