2025 COPS Office Collaborative Reform Initiative (CRI) Program Award

The Office of Community Oriented Policing Services (COPS Office) Collaborative Reform Initiative (CRI) program encompasses three programs offering expert services to state, local, territorial, and tribal law enforcement agencies, ranging in scope and complexity, at the voluntary request of agencies. Together, the services are designed to highlight best practices of law enforcement agencies and the many ways they are protecting Americans, enhancing officer safety and wellness, building agencies' capacity for self-improvement and effectiveness, and promoting common sense policing strategies nationwide.

CRI Awards

The 2025 CRI program funded one project to support the Collaborative Reform Initiative Technical Assistance Center (CRI-TAC).

Funding Provisions

Provisions include the following:

- In FY 2025, the COPS Office awarded \$4,375,000 million under the CRI program.
- Generally, the CRI program was open to for-profit (commercial) organizations, nonprofit organization, and institutions of higher education. Categories and subcategories had individual eligibility criteria. Accepted proposals were responsive to the solicitations.
