Madhuri (Madhu) Grewal is Policy Counsel at The Constitution Project, where she focuses primarily on advocacy and public education on criminal justice issues, including sentencing reform, the death penalty, and the right to counsel. Previously, Madhu worked as Policy Counsel at the Detention Watch Network (DWN), a national coalition of organizations working at the intersection of immigration law and criminal justice issues. She managed the organization's legal work and policy advocacy to push for administrative and legislative reforms to the immigration detention and deportation system in the United States.

Prior to her work with DWN, Madhu was a Department of Justice Honors Attorney, clerking for two years at the East Mesa Immigration Court, which is housed in a detention facility on the U.S.-Mexico border. There, she helped immigration judges navigate policies and litigation regarding prolonged detention and the due process rights of mentally ill detained immigrants. Previously, Madhu was a law clerk to the Senior Judges of the D.C. Superior Court, working primarily in the criminal division. Before law school, Madhu worked for Campus Progress, the youth organizing division at the Center for American Progress (CAP). She continued working for CAP as a civil rights organizer and consultant during law school.

Madhu is a Board Member of the APABA-DC Educational Fund (AEF), a non-profit that provides educational and mentorship opportunities and fellowships related to the legal profession and the Asian Pacific American community. She is a graduate of American University Washington School of Law and the University of Michigan, and is a member of the State Bar of California.
