Wind River Reservation law enforcement. Sponsored by: Select Committee on Tribal Relations

A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to law enforcement; authorizing tribal law enforcement officers to enforce state traffic laws as 2 3 specified; requiring an agreement between state and tribal 4 authorities; providing for liability coverage; requiring certification of tribal law enforcement officers by the 5 peace officer standards and training commission; defining б 7 terms; requiring rulemaking; providing legislative findings; and providing for an effective date. 8 9 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming: 10

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12 Section 1. W.S. 7-2-109 and 9-1-712 are created to 13 read:

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2 7-2-109. Authority of tribal law enforcement 3 officers; legislative findings. 4 (a) The legislature finds that allowing tribal law 5 enforcement officers to enforce state traffic laws on the б Wind River Indian Reservation is in the best interest of 7 8 the residents of the Wind River Indian Reservation and all 9 users of public roads and highways on the Wind River Indian 10 Reservation. The grant of authority is intended to increase 11 the number of law enforcement officers available to quickly 12 and effectively respond to traffic violations, including driving under the influence offenses. 13

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Tribal law enforcement officers who are certified 15 (b) according to W.S. 9-1-712 are authorized to enforce state 16 traffic laws as set forth in this section, except as 17 18 provided in subsection (m) of this section. The authority 19 of tribal law enforcement officers certified according to 20 W.S. 9-1-712 shall be limited to exercising the authority a Wyoming peace officer is authorized to exercise 21 in 22 enforcing state traffic laws, but only:

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(i) Within the geographic boundaries of the Wind
 River Indian Reservation; or

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4 (ii) While in fresh pursuit of a person who the 5 officer has probable cause to believe has committed a 6 violation of a state traffic law within the Wind River 7 Indian Reservation and enforcing violations of state 8 traffic laws that have occurred outside of the Wind River 9 Indian Reservation observed in the course of the fresh 10 pursuit.

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12 (c) To manage incidents occurring while acting 13 pursuant to subsection (b) of this section, in advance of 14 any incident, tribal law enforcement officers and state or 15 local law enforcement agencies may enter into a written 16 memorandum of understanding regarding operating procedures.

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(d) A tribal law enforcement officer may exercise the authority granted by this section provided the entity employing the officer has entered into an agreement with the state, to be signed by the attorney general, to comply with all applicable requirements and regulations of the department of transportation and the department of health

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with respect to implementation and administration of state 1 2 traffic laws, including the administration of chemical 3 tests. The agreement entered into under this subsection 4 shall also provide that the entity employing the arresting 5 officer agrees to pay the expenses associated with any of the following: б 7 8 (i) Chemical tests administered at the direction of a tribal law enforcement officer; 9 10 11 (ii) Transporting prisoners; 12 (iii) Medical care of offenders until the 13 offender is transferred to a county detention facility. 14 15 (e) A tribal law enforcement officer in connection 16 17 with the enforcement of state traffic laws under this 18 section may do any of the following: 19 20 (i) Testify in state courts as a law enforcement 21 witness; 22

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1 (ii) Make arrests as provided in W.S. 7-2-102 and 2 issue citations into state court provided in as 3 W.S. 7-2-103; 4 (iii) Apply for search warrants, arrest warrants 5 and other appropriate writs in circuit or state district б 7 court; 8 9 (iv) Execute warrants and writs outside the Wind Reservation provided the officer 10 Indian is River 11 accompanied by a peace officer employed by the jurisdiction 12 in which the action is taken; 13 (v) Use the chemical testing laboratory of the 14 15 Wyoming public health laboratory; 16 17 (vi) Transport prisoners. 18 19 (f) If an offender is taken into custody by a tribal 20 enforcement officer under the authority of this law section, the offender shall be promptly delivered to the 21 appropriate county detention center unless the offender 22 requires immediate medical attention. An offender requiring 23

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1 immediate medical attention shall be delivered to the 2 appropriate county detention facility when the offender is released from medical care. 3 4 (g) A tribal law enforcement officer making an arrest 5 or issuing a citation for violation of a state traffic law 6 7 under this section shall: 8 9 (i) Report the action to the appropriate state 10 or local law enforcement officials with jurisdiction over 11 the matter within twenty-four (24) hours; 12 13 (ii) Ensure that all necessary copies of 14 citations and other documents are filed in the appropriate state court and with the appropriate county prosecuting 15 16 attorney within twenty-four (24) hours; 17 18 (iii) Refer any public inquiry into the matter 19 to state or local law enforcement according to operating 20 procedures agreed to among the law enforcement agencies; 21 (iv) Comply with all statutory, regulatory and 22 23 administrative requirements of the department of

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1 transportation and the department of health applicable to
2 the administration and enforcement of state traffic laws.
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4 (h) The same degree and extent of all pension, relief, disability, workers' compensation insurance and 5 other benefits that apply to the officer and to the entity б by whom the officer is employed when the officer is 7 performing duties to enforce tribal or federal law within 8 the Wind River Indian Reservation shall apply when the 9 10 officer is enforcing state traffic laws under this section.

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12 (j) Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, any tribal law enforcement officer 13 while enforcing a state traffic law under this section shall be 14 considered a peace officer and employee of the state of 15 16 Wyoming for purposes of coverage and representation under the Wyoming Governmental Claims Act, W.S. 1-39-101 through 17 18 1-39-120, and the state self-insurance program, W.S. 1-41-101 19 through 1-41-111. This subsection shall not apply if 20 liability arising out of such services lies against the 21 United States.

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1 Nothing in this section shall be interpreted to (k) 2 limit or prevent the sheriff of Fremont county or Hot 3 Springs county from deputizing a tribal law enforcement 4 officer under the sheriff's separate authority and 5 discretion. 6 7 (m) Tribal law enforcement officers are not 8 authorized to enforce state traffic laws as set forth in 9 this section if the contact between the officer and the offender resulted from a roadblock within the Wind River 10 Indian Reservation that was not in compliance with title 7, 11 12 chapter 17 of the Wyoming statutes. 13 14 (n) As used in this section: 15 16 (i) "Chemical test" means as defined by 17 W.S. 31-5-233(a)(viii); 18 19 (ii) "State traffic laws" means title 31 of the 20 Wyoming statutes and rules promulgated pursuant to those 21 statutes; 22

3	Affairs, the Northern Arapaho tribe or Eastern Shoshone
